Registration:

All teaching staff must hold current Teacher Registration with the Victorian Institute of Teaching. It is the responsibility of the teacher to meet re-registration requirements on an annual basis. <u>https://www.vit.vic.edu.au/</u> If you are a Graduate teacher in your first year - Graduate Release will be provided and a mentor. For any subsequent years of Provisional Registration, a mentor will be provided and any release for observations etc. negotiated with Principal and/or Deputy Principal. Code of Ethics and Conduct:

The Victorian Teaching Profession's Codes of Conduct and Ethics are public statements developed for and by the teaching profession to:

- reflect shared principles about practice, conduct and ethics to be applied to promote the highest standards of professional practice
- enable registered teachers to reflect on their ethical decisions
- establish the quality of behaviour that reflects the expectations of the profession and the community, and

• provide a clear statement to the community about these expectations.

Suitability & Fitness to Teach:

The VIT is responsible for assessing whether those who apply for registration and those who currently hold registration are <u>suitable to teach</u>. A teacher is suitable to teach if their:

- character, reputation and conduct are such that they should be allowed to teach in a school or early childhood service, and
- physical or mental impairment (if any) does not seriously detrimentally affect, or is unlikely to seriously detrimentally affect, their ability to practise as a teacher.
